As you may know, last year the Colorado legislature passed, and Governor Polis signed into law, legislation that created statewide targets to reduce carbon emissions in Colorado - including emissions from power plants, factories, and vehicles - by at least 50% by 2030 and by at least 90% by 2050.

This law set these targets, but it did not specify how the state would meet them. Instead, it directed the Colorado Air Quality Control Commission [the air quality commission] to develop rules to achieve these targets.
